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*Raglan sweaters are worked top down in rounds.**This creates diagonal "lines" running from the neckline to the underarm on both the front and back. No seaming is required.**All rows are with edge stitch at the beginning and edge stitch at the end of each row.**The indications for sizes S/M/L/XL are given in the corresponding color. If only one indication is given, it applies to all sizes.***Abbreviations:**

k	knit stitch
p	purl stitch
st/sts	stitch/es
SM	stitch marker

Needlesize: No. 4.50 (US 7 | UK 7)

circular needle – 80 cm cable (32")

5 double-pointed needles (DPNs)

Hook size: No. 4.00 (US G | UK 8)**Yarn requirement:**

No. 40 (azalea)

approx. 360 g = approx. 900 m for S

approx. 380 g = approx. 950 m for M

approx. 410 g = approx. 1,025 m for L

approx. 450 g = approx. 1,125 m for XL

No. 62 (mignonette)

approx. 125 g = approx. 313 m for S

approx. 150 g = approx. 375 m for M

No. 99 (black)

approx. 200 g = approx. 500 m for S

All rights reserved.**Basic Pattern: Stockinette Stitch in Rounds:**

any number of stitches

Round: knit all stitches**Stockinette Stitch in Rows:****Right Side Row:** knit all stitches**Wrong Side Row:** purl all stitches**Instructions:** The *raglan sweater* is worked in rounds from the top down.**It is important to separate** the front, back, and both sleeves with **stitch markers**.*I recommend starting with double-pointed needles, using the individual needles to separate the sections. After working enough increases, switch to a circular needle and place the markers.**Once the sleeves are placed on hold, continue knitting the front and back in rounds.**The "point" is worked flat in rows.**After that, **each sleeve** is worked **separately** in rounds.**In the end, only the small gap under the sleeves needs to be closed, and the **edges** are **finished** with a round of single crochet (**UK Terms: double crochet**).***Pattern****write-up:**Cast on: **104/104/116/116 sts** —> for sizes S/M/L/XL

using a set of DPNs No. 4.50 (US 7 | UK 7)

in **color No. 62 (mignonette)**

join to work in the round

Distribute the stitches as follows:

Needle 1: 33/33/39/39 sts**front****Needle 2:** 19/19/19/19 sts**1st shoulder/sleeve****Needle 3:** 33/33/39/39 sts**back****Needle 4:** 19/19/19/19 sts**2nd shoulder/sleeve**After the cast-on, work a total of **3 rounds without increases** for the **neckline border**.After finishing the neckline border, begin with the **increases**.

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The increases are always worked by knitting into the **strand between stitches** (M1). These stitches are then knitted on the following round.

From now on, work these increases in every round as follows: (+ 8 sts/Rd)

On DPNs: always after the 1st st and before the last st on each needle.

On circular needle: always after the 1st st and before the last st at each marker.

TIP:

Change from DPNs to a circular needle once, after the increases, you have at least 176 sts on the needles.

Following this principle, work a total of **38/42/44/47 rounds with increases** (= 408/440/468/492 sts)

Now change to **color no. 99 (black)** and work another **4 rounds with increases** (= 440/472/500/524 sts)

Then work **1 round without increases** before **placing the sleeves on hold**.

Continue as follows: (using circular needle)

1. knit the **front** in the basic pattern (= 117/125/135/141 sts)
2. keep marker
3. place sleeve stitches on a holder (= 103/111/115/121 sts)
4. **remove marker**.
5. knit the **back** in the main pattern directly after the front (= 117/125/135/141 sts)
6. keep marker
7. place sleeve stitches on a holder (= 103/111/115/121 sts)

You now have a total of **234/250/270/282 sts** on the circular needle (2 stitch markers separate front and back)

Now continue working the front and back in the basic pattern and in **color no. 99 (black)** for **32/32/34/38 rounds without any increases or decreases**.

Then **change to color no. 40 (azalea)** and continue for **86/86/84/80 rounds without any increases or decreases**.

Now work the "point" section.

For this section, continue **working flat in rows** as follows:

On RS rows: knit 3 sts at the beginning, and knit 3 sts twisted together at the end of the row (-4 sts per row).

On WS rows: purl all sts.

Continue in this manner until no further decreases are possible.

Bind off the remaining stitches loosely.

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No. 62 (mignonette)
No. 99 (black)

Gauge:

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Now work the **first sleeve**.Transfer **the stitches on hold** to **4 double-pointed needles** and distribute as follows:**Needle 1:** 34/37/38/40 sts**Needle 2:** 35/37/39/41 sts**Needle 3:** 34/37/38/40 stsWork **5 rounds** in **color no. 99 (black)**.Then begin the **decrease rounds**.*In each decrease round, work as follows:***On Needle 1:** knit the first 2 sts together (k2tog).**On Needle 3:** slip 1 st, knit 1, pass slipped st over (ssk).Continue in the same manner, **decreasing 2 sts 1 time**, then **decrease 2 sts every 5th round 28/28/28/29 times**.**NOTE:**After a total of **37/37/39/43 rounds** (counted from picking up the previously held stitches), **change to color no. 62 (reseda)**.In total, work **149/149/149/154 rounds**.Finally, **bind off** the remaining stitches.**Work the second sleeve in the same way, except without a color change – knit it entirely in colour no. 99 (black).****Finishing:****Finally, work 1 round of single crochet (UK Terms: double crochet) around all edges using a 4.00 mm crochet hook (US G | UK 8) in color no. 99 (black).**

Close the small gaps under the sleeves.

Weave in all loose ends neatly.
